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IN 2024, **HEART TO HEART** INTERNATIONAL

(HHI) remained dedicated to its mission of expanding healthcare access worldwide. HHI addressed critical needs in communities facing disasters, crises, and resource limitations through a range of initiatives. These included delivering lifesaving medicines and medical supplies, deploying medical teams, and installing laboratory technology in free and charitable health clinics. This annual report highlights how your generosity transformed lives and delivered hope for a healthier future.

BEYOND THE STORM: LONG-TERM RECOVERY FROM HELENE AND MILTON

The 2024 hurricane season brought unprecedented challenges to the Southeast, with Hurricanes Helene and Milton leaving a trail of destruction across multiple states. Heart to Heart International mounted a comprehensive response, addressing both the immediate crisis and the longterm recovery needs of affected communities.

Hurricane Helene's impact was particularly severe in western North Carolina, where historic flooding isolated entire towns. Just as these communities began to recover, Hurricane Milton struck Florida, bringing more devastation.

HHI's response was multifaceted, leveraging our diverse programs to maximize impact:

- C Immediate Medical Care: We deployed a medical team to western North Carolina to provide on-the-ground care in the wake of Hurricane Helene.
- C Essential Supplies: We distributed over 50,000 hygiene kits to survivors across five states in the aftermath of Hurricane Helene, and an additional 12,000 kits to Florida communities affected by Hurricane Milton.
- Medicine and Aid: We shipped over \$2.2 million in medicines and essential supplies to support relief efforts.
- C Long-Term Healthcare Support: Recognizing the importance of sustainable recovery, our laboratory team installed point-of-care laboratory technology in Oceana Health, a clinic in Florida that had been impacted by Hurricane Milton. This new technology will enhance the clinic's ability to serve their community for years to come. Support for a lab installation in a clinic affected by Hurricane Helene is ongoing in 2025.

This integrated approach—combining immediate relief with investments in long-term healthcare infrastructure—reflects HHI's commitment to building resilient communities.

















DISASTER RESPONSE

Heart to Heart International's Disaster Response **Team** mobilizes rapidly to deliver critical aid in the wake of disasters. In 2024, we provided hygiene kits, medicines, medical supplies, and mobile medical teams to communities around the world.

Dr. Gustave Wilde, a volunteer who served after Hurricane Helene, witnessed the impact firsthand. "Every client was so very grateful," he shared. "Heart to Heart International provided not only much-needed medical care but showed my humble neighbors love, compassion, and an assurance that they were not forgotten."

Our commitment to preparedness and rapid response, combined with the dedication of our volunteers, allowed us to bring both immediate relief and longterm support to communities in crisis.



ACCESS TO MEDICINE

Our Access to Medicine program provides essential medications to clinics and hospitals in under-resourced communities. This initiative ensures that patients have access to treatments for a range of conditions, including infections, cardiac issues, and thyroid conditions.

A powerful example of the program's impact can be seen in Honduras, where Nelly, a young mother with epilepsy, relies on Hospital El Progreso, which receives donations from HHI. In Honduras, as in many under-resourced settings, high pharmacy prices create a barrier between patients and the medications they need. HHI's Access to Medicine program removes

this barrier, ensuring that Nelly and others with life-saving needs can receive their treatments.

LABORATORY

In 2024, Heart to Heart International's Laboratory program transformed healthcare access in the United States by installing new point-of-care laboratory technology in 10 charitable clinics across seven states.

The benefits of this program are far-reaching. By eliminating the need for off-site testing, patients experience:




A total of 57 labs installed in 28 states since the program's beginning.

Reduced wait times: Results are available within minutes, enabling faster diagnoses and treatment.

C Lower costs: Patients avoid transportation expenses and potential lost wages associated with multiple appointments.

• Greater convenience: All aspects of care, from testing to treatment planning, can be completed in a single visit.

This technology is particularly impactful for patients with chronic conditions requiring regular monitoring. For example, Antonia, who has a clotting disorder, previously had to visit the hospital weekly for lab work. Now, her local clinic can provide both the necessary care and the immediate test results, significantly improving her quality of life.



COMMUNITY HEALTH

Our Community Health program improves access to care by bringing essential healthcare services directly to where people live, work, and gather, offering crucial interventions like vaccinations, vision screenings, and diabetes (A1c) testing at local events.

Notably, our A1c testing initiatives revealed a startling statistic: 80% of individuals with abnormal A1c levels were previously unaware of their condition.

During one event, we identified a man in his 20s with dangerously high A1c levels. Thanks to our established partnerships with local healthcare providers, we were able to immediately connect him to the necessary care, preventing potentially severe complications.

> This experience, and others like it, directly led to the creation of our new Diabetes Reduction Program.

HHI goes beyond simply providing testing; we are committed to ensuring comprehensive follow-up care and ongoing support, empowering individuals to manage their health and achieve healthier outcomes.







HYGIENE KITS

Hygiene kits are at the heart of our mission, meeting urgent needs and

restoring hope for people in crisis. These kits contain essential items that enable individuals and families to maintain basic hygiene and sanitation, promoting health and preventing the spread of disease in vulnerable settings.

In 2024, we distributed kits around the world to people impacted by natural disasters, violence and poverty.

- In Gaza, displaced women shared how the kits restored dignity and empowered them to manage hygiene with privacy.
- O In Ukraine, they reached war-injured civilians and displaced families in hospitals, shelters, and schools.
- In North Carolina, hurricane survivors who lost their homes found comfort and relief through these essential supplies.

Whether in the aftermath of a natural disaster or during a humanitarian crisis, each hygiene kit delivers more than just soap and shampoo. It delivers a powerful message of compassion and reminds recipients that they are not alone.
